


Welcoming the Stranger 2024 Report


Student and Class Registrations

- **Winter:** 303 unique students registered for 51 classes
- **Spring:** 301 unique students registered for 46 classes
- **Summer:** 59 unique students registered for 10 classes
- **Fall:** 306 unique students registered for 45 classes
- **A total,** of 630 unique students registered for classes during 2024




Class Enrollment

- 1,153 class enrollments by 630 unique students
- 1053 enrollments in ESL classes to increase English language proficiency
- 37 enrollments in computer classes to gain technical skills and knowledge
- 63 enrollments in citizenship preparation classes to learn more about U.S. civics and to gain U.S citizenship
- 10 of the WTS students gained their U.S. citizenship




Classes

- A total of 152 classes
- 120 ESL classes
- 15 Computer classes
- 17 Citizenship preparation classes




Volunteer Teachers

- A total of 83 volunteers taught one or more classes
- 45 were returning volunteers
- 38 were new to the program
- A total of 3,152 instructional hours




Student Learning Hours

- In total, students received 9,389 hours of instruction
- 8,898 student hours in ESL classes
- 138 student hours in computer classes
- 353 student hours in citizenship classes




Other Volunteer Hours

- Volunteers dedicated over 1,078 hours of service
- Volunteers contributed time to committees (Strategic Planning; Technology; Curriculum; and Marketing/Development), administrative activities, and training




Student Residency and Regions of Origin

- 90% of our students reside in Eastern Pennsylvania (56% Bucks County, 23% Philadelphia County, and 11% Montgomery County)
- 10% reside in Burlington, Mercer, and Hunterdon Counties in New Jersey




- During 2024, our students came from 57 different countries.
- 45% from Europe (including all of Russia)
- 20% from Asia (exclusive of Russia)
- 11% from South America
- 8% from the Caribbean
- 7% from North America
- 4% from Central America
- 3% from Africa, and
- 2% from Middle East



Financial Support

- 217 individuals, 17 corporations, 7 foundations, and 9 faith based organizations financially supported our work
- 78 % of our budget comes from individuals
- 13 % comes from Foundations
- 5 % comes from Faith Based Organizations, and
- 4 % comes from Corporations



Outreach

- Numerous families connected to resources for housing, food, financial assistance, and education
- WTS made four presentations to community groups interested in knowing more about our work and our students
