


Students and Class Distribution

- Winter: 130 students took 165 classes
- Spring: 155 students took 191 classes
- Summer: 77 students took 83 classes
- Fall: 134 students took 174 classes
- In total, 275 students registered for classes during 2021




Class Registration

- 613 class enrollments by 275 students during 2021
- 429 enrollments ESL classes to increase English language proficiency
- 116 enrollments computer classes to gain technical skills and knowledge
- 68 enrollments citizenship preparation classes to learn more about U.S. civics and to gain U.S citizenship
- 10 of the WTS students gained their U.S. citizenship




Classes

- A total of 167 classes were held during 2021
- 118 ESL classes
- 30 Computer classes
- 19 Citizenship preparation classes




Volunteer Teachers

- A total of 41 volunteers taught one or more classes during 2021
- 28 were returning volunteers
- 13 were new to the program
- Volunteer teachers provided a total of 1,573 instructional hours during the year




Student Learning Hours

- In total, students attended 4,555 instructional hours
- 3,497 student hours were in ESL classes
- 384 student hours were in citizenship classes
- 674 student hours were in computer classes




Other Volunteer Hours

- Volunteers dedicated over 1,042 hours of service
- Volunteers contributed time to committees (Strategic Planning; Technology; Curriculum; and Marketing/Development), community representation, administrative activities, and training



Financial Support

- 260 individuals, 11 organizations, 10 foundations and 7 churches financially supported our work
- 64% of our budget comes from individuals, 32 % from foundation grants and 4% from organizations and churches



Outreach

- 7 Welcoming the Stranger families (excluded from Federal aid for COVID-19) each received a check for \$700.00, funded by a \$5,000 grant awarded to WTS by the Pennsylvania Immigration and Citizenship Coalition (PICC)
- WTS connected numerous families to resources for housing, food, income and further education
- WTS made four presentations to community groups interested in knowing more about our work and our students

• WTS partnered with more than 69 other not-for-profits involved with immigrants and immigrant rights, including PICC, PA is Ready, HIAS, and Immigrant Rights Action Group (IRAG), joining them in 11 local workshops, and 26 partnerships meetings
