## Immense Growth in Student Enrollment in 2017



Incredible growth in student numbers over the past few years has been fulfilling but challenging to our limited resources. This growth was partly caused by greater relationships and connections with our community and partly caused by the diminishing services in other service areas which drew more students to our classes. In the past year alone, we have gained almost 500 new students in our classes.
Percentage-wise, we have grown $146 \%$ since 2015 . This has created a set of challenges that we successfully worked to meet with a smaller-than-usual budget in 2017.

## Student Confidence

In class surveys taken in the fall of 2017, $88 \%$ of students surveyed report having more confidence in their English skills, 12\% report feeling the same level of confidence as when they began class, and $0 \%$ report having less confidence.

In May, WTS was named one of the best charities in Bucks County, and our

Clothing Drive:
With the help of Episcopal Church of the Advent (Hatboro), Salem United Church of Christ (Doylestown), Yardley United Methodist Church, Southampton Friends Meeting, St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church (Morrisville), Accupac, Inc (Harleysville), and countless community members, students, and volunteers, WTS was able to collect 12,381 pounds of clothing and raise over $\$ 3,000$ to help support our programs this fall.


Fundraising Events:
This year's sold out annual International Dinner was our biggest and best yet with 300 guests in attendance to enjoy food and fellowship! In September, UCC Salem in Doylestown hosted a benefit concert for Welcoming the Stranger and A Woman's Place that was rich with talent. This past July, renowned artist Sara Klatchko hosted a Kids Around the World event featuring her global photography in partnership with Cultural Care Au Pair, Pumped Up Kids, LLC, and Bryn Gweled Homesteads.

## Social Justice Initiatives:

This past year, Welcoming the Stranger has recognized an uptick in fear and discrimination in our local communities. In keeping with our mission to welcome all strangers with peace and acceptance, we took part in several initiatives to help. In the beginning of 2017 we joined together with several local leaders to form One Bucks, a coalition to denounce hate
acts and promote peace and community in Bucks County.Throughout the year, we partnered with groups such as Bucks County Human Relations Council, Bucks County Marching Forward, Interfaith Community of Lower Bucks, Rise Up Doylestown, and The Peace Center to co-sponsor events like the Middle East Potluck for Peace, Vigil for Syria in Doylestown, Town Hall in Bristol Borough Addressing White Nationalism, Many Faiths, One Community (a show of solidarity for our Muslim neighbors), and Speak Up For Peace and March Against Hate in Levittown in response to racist hate crimes. As a founding partner of Immigrant Rights Action Group Doylestown, we offered trainings and workshops on "Know Your Rights" topics and assisted in legal aid and referrals to those who needed these services.
